God's Message for Today's Church

(Sunday September 6th 2020 with Gympie Baptist Church)

Today we look at the last question asked by you the congregation regarding concerns that you have around all that is happening, as a result of the Covid pandemic. The specific question we are addressing this morning has been framed this way, "Why Do Christians suffer and how should they respond"? The bible gives many answers to this two-pronged question and these are all very important to know and understand. With the limited time I have this morning I will endeavour to outline from the scriptures the following: 1) Some of the major reasons Christians suffer; 2) The reality of this being somewhat normative for all Christians from the "get-go"; 3) What Paul says about the purpose of Christian suffering as taken from 2 Corinthians Chapter 1:1-11.

1) Christian Suffering?

2) It's the Same Old Story From the "get-go"!

3) "Milking" Your Difficulties for your Good and Everyone else's including God's, for this is His purpose.

A key passage for answering this morning's question is found in 2nd Corinthians Chapter 1:1-11

f 1 Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother,

To the church of God that is at Corinth, with all the saints who are in the whole of Achaia: ² Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

God of All Comfort

³ Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, ⁴ who comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God. ⁵ For as we share abundantly in Christ's sufferings, so through Christ we share abundantly in comfort too. ⁶ If we are afflicted, it is for your comfort and salvation; and if we are comforted, it is for your comfort, which you experience when you patiently endure the same sufferings that we suffer. ⁷ Our hope for you is unshaken, for we know that as you share in our sufferings, you will also share in our comfort.

⁸ For we do not want you to be unaware, brothers, of the affliction we experienced in Asia. For we were so utterly burdened beyond our strength that we despaired of life itself. ⁹ Indeed, we felt that we had received the sentence of death. But that was to make us rely not on ourselves but on God who raises the dead. ¹⁰ He delivered us from such a deadly peril, and he will deliver us. On him we have set our hope that he will deliver us again. ¹¹ You also must help us by prayer, so that many will give thanks on our behalf for the blessing granted us through the prayers of many.
